GERMAN NOTE IS DELIVERED
 (Continued from Page One.)
 have been bound to take official cognizance in its duty as a neutral power in the enforcement of National laws.

Germany Willing
 The Government of the United States is happy to observe that your Excellency's note closes with the intimation that the German government is willing now, as before, to accept the good offices of the United States in an attempt to come to an understanding with Great Britain by which the character and conditions of the war upon the sea may be changed.

U. S. Ready to Help.
 The Government of the United States would consider it a privilege to thus serve its friends and the world. It stands ready at any time to convey to either government any intimation or suggestion the other may be willing to convey, and cordially invites the German Government to make use of its services in this way at its convenience. The whole world is concerned in anything that may bring about even partial accommodation of interests or in any way mitigate the terrors that are present in the distressing conflict.

Shipping Rights.
 The Government of the United States cannot admit that the proclamation of the war zone from which neutral ships have been warned to keep away, may be made to operate in any way as an abbreviation of the rights either of American shipmasters or American citizens bound on lawful errands as passengers on merchant ships of a belligerent nationality. It does not understand the German Government to question these rights.

Must be Protected.
 It understands it is also to accept as established beyond question the principles that the lives of non-combatants cannot lawfully or rightfully be put in jeopardy by the capture or destruction of unresisting merchantmen, and to recognize the obligation and to take sufficient precaution to ascertain whether the suspected merchantman is in fact carrying contraband of war under a neutral flag.

Asks Safeguard.
 The Government of the United States therefore deems it reasonable to expect that the German government will adopt such measures necessary to put these principles into practice in respect to the safeguarding of American lives and American ships, and asks for assurance that this will be done.

ALLEY IS INDICTED
 FEDERAL GRAND JURY AGAIN AFTER ROSEBURG MAN
 Alleged That He Made People Make False Statements Regarding Timber Claims
 The federal grand jury has returned another indictment against Frank E. Alley, lawyer and timber man of Roseburg, and well known here. Regarding the case a Portland paper says:
 "Frank E. Alley, prominent attorney of Roseburg, and Charles L. Byron, a Seattle timber locator, were indicted by the federal grand jury in connection with the charge made by the Government that they induced timber locators to give wrong estimates of the value of timber claims with intent to defraud the Government."
 "The new indictment charges Mr. Alley and Mr. Byron with having entered into a conspiracy to commit subordination of perjury."
 "It is alleged by the government that the defendants induced approximately 50 land locators to appear before the register and receiver of the Roseburg land office and to swear, first, that they had made personal examination of the claims in question, and, second, that they knew from personal examination that the claims were worth only \$425 each. The government asserts that none of the locators had examined the lands, and that instead of being worth only \$425 each the claims averaged more than \$5,000 each in value."
 "An indictment on these charges, returned last February, fell through a few weeks ago when Federal Judge Bean sustained a demurrer to the indictment on the ground that a timber claim is not a claim against the United States, as contemplated under the statutes."
 "The last indictment for conspiracy to commit subordination of perjury was returned in the Government's next step Alley and Mr. Byron with having entered in the case."
