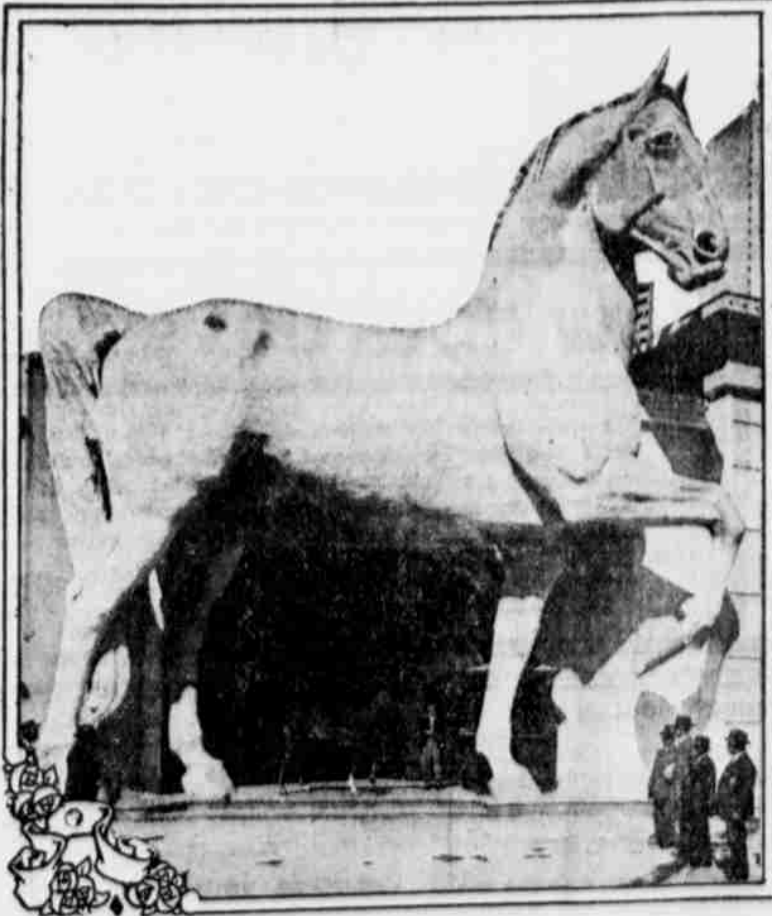

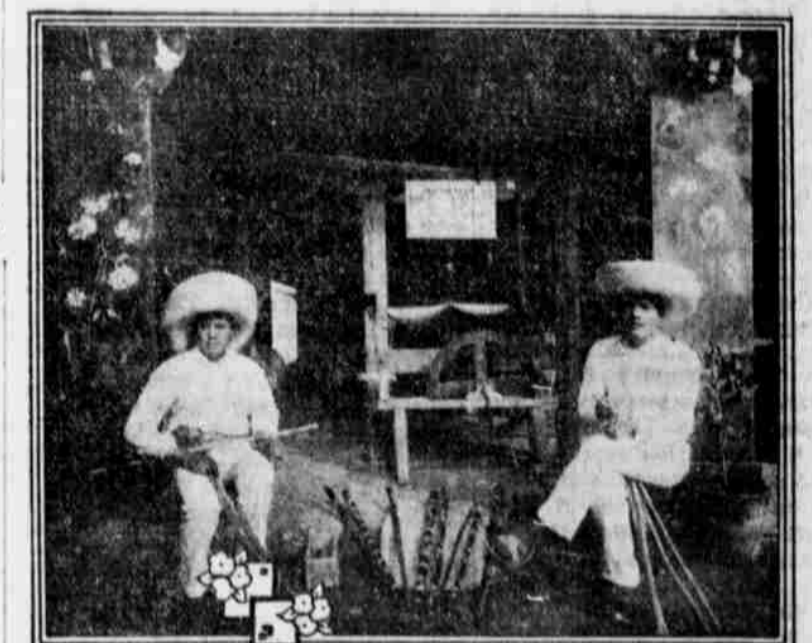


YEAR AGO DIFFERENT FROM PRESENT TIME
