EXPORTATION OF LUMBER

THE proposed co-operation of the lumber manufacturers of the Pacific northwest under the name of the Douglas Fir Exploitation and Export company, of which much has been heard during the last month by those most vitally interested, is as yet only tentative.

The corporation by-laws provide for a capital of \$200,000, to be divided among about twenty members.

The object of the new corporation however, is worthy, and will undoubtedly have a sufficiently broad field in increasing the sale of Douglas fir in the markets of the world.

The men active in this undertaking are not novices in business, and will have a strong working agreement, which it is believed will include a majority of the tidewater mills of importance in the Northwest.

High-class representatives can be sent to foreign countries to get orders without the expense being a burden to the individual manufacturer.

An active lumber market makes good business in many other lines, and with the mills running full time this country has always been prosperous.
