Bartle, the chairman of the committee presided. A finance committee was appointed composed of John G. Mullen, chairman; V. C. Gorst, Peter Loggie and William Schrock. The advertising committee selected was composed of B. B. Weldy, Ira B. Bartle and A. K. Arkley. The whole of Coos County and this part of the state will be invited to participate. The carnival will be a celebration of the completing of the bridge and the coming of the Southern Pacific railroad to this point. There will be sports of different kinds and races. Dr. Bartle says that there will be some auto races which will exceed anything of the kind given here and that some fast time will be made if it is necessary for himself to race with Dr. Dix. In order to insure fast travelling, the speed limit will be removed and some thrillers are promised in the auto racing line. The details of the program have not yet been worked out but it is assured that there will be plenty of entertainment for those who attend and the city will prepare for a big crowd.

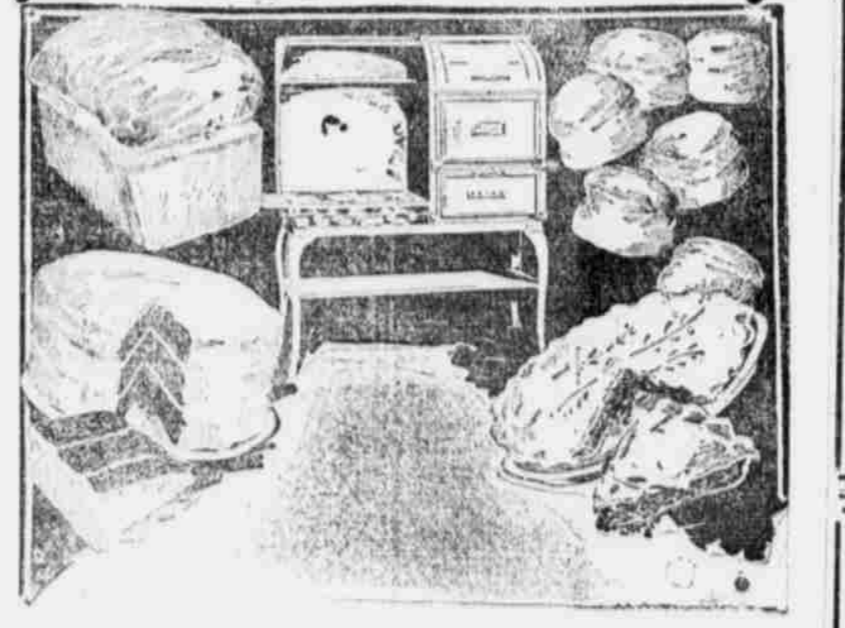
