

STAGE IS ALL SET

ELKS HIGH JINKS AT BANDON BIG DRAWING CARD

George Goodrum Says 2000 People Going From Coos Bay—Every One is Invited to Attend

Elks, big ones and little ones, all shapes and sizes and with their friends galore, will form a mighty herd on the Bandon Beach tomorrow. It is the High Jinks Day—the annual gathering. Every one in the county has been invited and for their amusement and pleasure a bounteous repast will be served. There is to be a program of sports, all kinds of sports. Men will race in tubs far out in the surf, others will swim. There will be auto races on the beach. And to show that there are more ways of "skinning a cat" the gasoline buggies will race both forwards and backwards.

The train to Coquille is scheduled to leave at 7:10 in the morning. At Coquille there will be special boats for the down-river trip. It is expected that 10 o'clock will see the up-river delegation landed in Bandon. The returning boats will leave for Coquille at six o'clock where the train will be waiting. The round trip fare has been reduced to \$1.55 for the occasion.

Thousands Going

George Goodrum, asked how many would be there from Coos Bay, answered in a second: "Two thousand." He says he has quit figuring in the hundreds for a trip like this one. "What's the use? Everybody's going."

Dozens of machines will travel the coast and the Valley roads. Many autos have already been chartered. The early start in the morning will place the entire crowd on the beach early in the day and give them at least eight hours for the jollification time.

Bandon Elks are the hosts. They have made practically all of the arrangements.

Now and then there has filtered through a glimmer of the stunts they are going to "pull off." One man in guessing, said they meant to throw every Coos Bay Elk into the bay to show off their harbor.

Two weeks ago committees from every city in the county were appointed to take charge of making up the delegations in their home towns. The reports already received show that every city is trying hard to get up a delegation to beat the one of any other place and between them all it is expected there will be several thousand persons Sunday on the Bandon Beach.

Program of Day.

The Bandon Western World gives the program for the day as follows:
10:30 a. m.—Excursion boats with crowds from Marshfield, North Bend, Coquille, Myrtle Point, Powers and intermediate points, headed by Coos Bay band, arrive at dock. Grand ensemble on wharf to give the visitors a royal welcome.

10:45 a. m.—Royal open air marriage ceremony, Miss Bandon and Mr. Marshfield, at corner of First street and Alabama avenue.

11:00 a. m.—Parade forms on First street; cash prize for best decorated car in Elk colors; Col. R. H. Rosa, marshal of the day.

11:20 a. m.—Water sports in bay at corner of First street and Edison avenue, cash prize.

12:00 a. m.—Free picnic lunch in grove near ball park.

1:00 p. m.—Wrestling exhibition; base ball game between Marshfield, Elks and Bandon Elks; auto races and other attractions.

3:15 p. m.—Surf sports, races, tennis game, etc., on the beach; near trail, only three minutes walk from ball park.

After the beach program there will be a band concert and frolic on the streets up town.

Moving pictures will be taken of all the interesting events from the time the boat arrives.
