No Moment of Quiet. Unanimously the crowd voted that the Bandon Elks are the best little entertainers in seven states. From the time the excursionists landed from the boats until they went back aboard at six o'clock last night, there was not a quiet moment. "Something doing all the time," read the posters. Truer words were never written.

Toward the waterfront, the end of First street the parade marched, both hands stirring the enthusiasm like a long ladle in a kettle of soup.

On a barge near the south jetty there was a pause to watch seven men fight for the supremacy of the float, the last one left to receive a \$10 prize. Way up to the top of the hill people were lined. At the signal the men clinched and the first five scrambled and piled and tumbled into the water like so many flies leaving two men named Lambert and Jack Ferron, a longshoreman, the sole occupants. It was ten minutes of hard tussling before the latter went into the water.

Plenty to Eat.

By two roads the machines and pedestrians filed to the grounds north of the ball park where a host of Elks had planned well for a hungry crowd. Long tables were filled, heaped and stacked with sandwiches, with waffles, pickles and crabs. There was plenty of coffee and into the midst went the hungry visitors and there was little noise until the cravings of the inner man, woman and child had been satisfied.
