WAR HAS CURTAILED DELIVERY OF MAIL

Shortage of Men in London Has Had Its Effect Upon the Postal Service

(By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times)

LONDON, July 28.—Shortages of men has led the British postal authorities to take renewed steps to curtail the free delivery service in various parts of the country. In the business section of London, where twelve deliveries a day were formerly made, the number was cut to six at the beginning of the war, and will now be further reduced. In smaller cities only three deliveries are now in operation.
