### NEWS OF OREGON

**SALEM**—The Oregon Supreme court ruled against the citizens of Roseburg who attempted to enjoin the special tax of \$300,000 voted to assist the construction of Kendall Brothers Logging road and mill.

**PORTLAND**—Live hogs are selling at \$7, having dropped thirty cents and below the eastern market.

**GRANTS PASS**—Otto Shtrmer intended going to South America but when he arrived at New York he feared traveling on a vessel laden with gasoline and came to Oregon for an outing and was accidentally shot by his own revolver the first day in the woods near Grants Pass.

**ALBANY**—The first wheat of the season has been received at Albany and the crop is now threshing from 20 to 30 bushels per acre.

**FLAVEL**—Two longshoremen were severely hurt in accidents that occurred at the Hill terminals.

**PORTLAND**—The old British prison ship Success, which has been visited by thousands at different ports, is to be brought to Portland.

**CORVALLIS**—Brigadier-General T. J. Thorp, a Civil War veteran and hero of 64 battles, was buried with full military honors, the members of the Oregon National Guard attending.

**ALBANY**—The members of the Knights of Pythias will hold a big conclave and initiation at Wizard Island, Crater Lake, Aug. 17 to 19.

**HUBBARD**—The Knights of Pythias hall erected at cost of \$3,500 by the Hubbard lodge has been dedicated.

**ROCKAWAY**—The plank road from Ocean Lake Park to Lake Lytle has been finished and this completes the last link in the chain of highways to Rockaway which will be used by Portland people.
