EUROPEAN WAR ONE YEAR AGO TODAY

September 2, 1914. The French minister of interior announces the temporary transfer of the capital from Paris to Bordeaux.

The left wing of the French army yields and the Germans are within forty-three miles of Paris.

Three German aeroplanes and two French machines fight over Paris, exchanging shots but the Germans escaped.

A German Zeppelin drops bombs on Antwerp damaging houses flying the Red Cross flag and wounding twelve persons.

Japan lands between 10,000 and 15,000 troops 100 miles north of Tsing-Tau, China.

Petrograd announces that the Austrian armies around Lemberg have been defeated by the Russians.

German and Austrian troops are reported to have occupied Lodz in Russian Poland.

Rumors that Turkey has declared war on Russia cannot be confirmed at Washington.

The U. S. cruiser Tennessee is to be utilized for the transportation of Americans from Havre to England.

STATEMENT BY ASSESSOR THRIFT

COOS ASSESSOR SAYS STATE OFFICER INCLUDED IN EXPENSES OF HIS OFFICE THE COST OF CRUISING TIMBER WHICH SHOULD NOT BE SO INCLUDED.

Editor Coos Bay Times: We find by investigation the report of the insurance commissioner that he has included in his report of the cost of the Assessor's office of Coos County Oregon for the Year 1914, the cost of the cruising the timber for that year.

The Cruising of the timber was contracted by the County Court with Mr. Dennis McCarthy and was entirely under the Court's control and not an item of expense of the Assessor's Office.

For the year 1914 \$4,959.82 was paid for cruising timber which amount should be deducted from the amount the commissioners report to ascertain the correct cost of the above mentioned office.

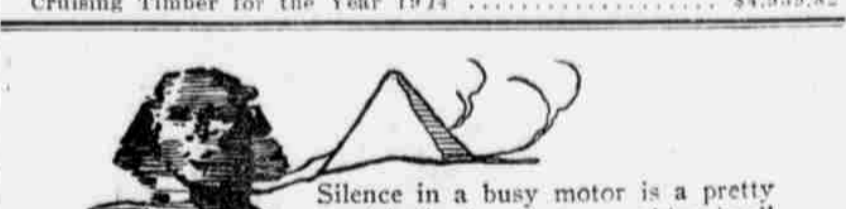
