RAISING RECRUITS

AUSTRALIA MAKING EVERY EFFORT TO GET MEN

Using Various Means to Induce the Young Men to Enlist in English Army

MELBOURNE, Australia, Sept. 17.—Everything possible is now being done to get more recruits in Australia—everything short of conscription itself. There are, after a year of the war, 50,000 Australians under arms, either in the fighting line at the Dardanelles or in training camps.

Although the Ministry of Defense doubts that it looks to conscription, a census of unmarried men has just been taken by the police of the various states to determine the fighting strength. The result of this has not been made public.

Easy to Enlist. Business houses all over Australia are making it easier for young men to enlist by either keeping up their pay or promising them their old places if they return; and to induce men—even with dependents—to join the colors, the press is by request of the military authorities, printing almost daily the liberal rates of pay for Australia on active service and the pensions which will be paid the disabled and the relatives of such officers.

Bring Back Wounded. Meanwhile wounded men are beginning to be brought back all the way from Gallipoli peninsula in fair numbers. By November it is likely that with cooler weather in the Red Sea many more will be returned home. Elaborate preparations have been made for the care and treatment of these soldiers.

War soon will cost, per day, \$25,000,000. Britain's enlisted to date, 2,900,000. To be spent from today to November 20, \$1,250,000,000. Seven hundred and fifteen factories making cannon food. Eight hundred thousand men and women in government munition factories. Conscription indicated to be a possibility. Franco-British lines impassable to Germany. Predicts victory through endurance and resources.
