

FIRST REPORT MADE VISIT GOOD ROADS

DETAILS OF WEIGHTS AND MEASURE INSPECTION GIVEN

Many Scales in State are Found Inaccurate, According to Official

What is being done by the state office of weights and measures is told in an interesting circular which has been published by Fred G. Buchtel, deputy state sealer. It covers the work of the first quarter under the new laws governing weights and measures enacted by the last Oregon legislature.

Many Found Faulty

That scales need testing is quite evident from the report which shows that out of a total of 2,958 scales tested 1,117 of them were weighing incorrectly and had to be either adjusted, condemned or corrected.

The type of scale commonly known as the "family scale," owing to its inferior construction and consequent inaccuracy, is not legal for use in trade and the state office has issued orders that it be condemned and its further use prohibited.

There has been seven cases of prosecution for the improper use of scales. In two cases convictions were secured and other cases are either pending or awaiting action of the grand jury.

Has Saved Farmers

In setting forth the advantages to be obtained by the inspection the deputy sealer in the circular says:

"To illustrate in a specific case, the value of the scale inspection, one of the creameries purchasing milk from the farmers, was unknowingly using a scale having an error of 4 pounds to the 100 pounds in the creamery's favor, causing a constant and considerable loss to the farmers of the vicinity. The district sealer immediately condemned the incorrect scale and required the installation of an accurate one, preventing further loss."

GOOD ROADS PARTY WHIZZES THROUGH COUNTY

State Highway Engineer, P. H. Burrell and County Court on Trip—Campaign of Education

To see for themselves firsthand the roads for which Coos would bond itself members of the county court together with E. J. Cantine, state Highway Engineer, P. H. Burrell, U. S. Senior Highway Engineer, Charles Hall, president of the Coos Good Roads Association and J. E. Montgomery, left in machines this morning for Bandon via the coast road and tonight they will hold an open Good Roads meeting in Coquille and in Myrtle Point tomorrow afternoon.

The party went in two autos, that of Charles Hall and Commissioner Armstrong. A visit was paid to Shore Acres, on the invitation last night of L. J. Simpson, and thence the party went over the Seven Devils road to Bandon. If they had time the party expected to go today part ways over the road to the Curry line to see what that highway is like. The trip will then be back over the river road to Coquille.

Make Entire Rounds

In making this circuit the party took in practically the entire stretch in the round chain that binds the cities of Coos.

The experience and advice of the state highway engineer is ever at the service of Coos county, declared Mr. Cantine this morning before leaving.

This is his first visit to this section "And I assure you too," he said, "that its not at all because I haven't wanted to come; it has simply been the press of road work in the north."

Engineer Willing to Help

He explained that his office stands ready to furnish, free, plans and surveys for roads and not only this, but they will actually come and take charge of the work and see that it is satisfactorily completed. This was done in the work along in Clatsop and Columbia counties in connection with the Columbia highway.

"Very often," said Mr. Cantine, "county courts are embarrassed in laying out roads. One section will be pulling against the other and the commissioners are placed between the devil and the deep blue sea. The state highway engineer's office can take charge of such work, if invited to, and come in, lay out the highways and see that they are constructed. We are continually doing this sort of thing in all parts of the state."

The campaign of education on the Good Roads proposition will be continued through the county and an effort will be made to meet as many voters as possible on this trip and explain to them exactly what the movement means and if possible to enlist their support in the bond issue.
