BULLET FROM HEART

Physician Performs Extraordinary Operation on Shrapnel Victim

BERLIN, Oct. 8,-The opening of chamber in the heart and extract-Freund and Dr. Casperson in the current number of Munich Medical was a soldier who young covered from a bullet wound through the liver. Upon X-ray examination preceding his discharge from the hospital a foreign object was discerned in the heart. It moved synchronously with the heart's pulsations, and the physicians decided that it was a shrapnel bullet.

To prevent possible dangerous complications it was determined to remove the bullet. The breast was opened, the pericardium slit sufficiently to permit the heart to be brought forward, a quick incision was made in the right ventricle and the bullet was immediately found and removed. Much blood was lost, but the bleeding stopped after prompt stitching, and the patient made a complete recovery.
