### TO PROTECT PUPILS

#### SCHOOL BOARD CONSIDERS SPECIAL HEALTH OFFICER

Discuss Paying Small Retaining Fee to Physicians to Diagnose Doubtful Cases in School

Special health officer for the pupils of the public schools was a topic of consideration at the school board meeting this morning and though nothing definite was done, the members expressed themselves in favor of such an officer.

Often there is fear of an epidemic spreading. Some pupil may come to school with a rash that immediately is taken for chicken pox or the like, and with a regular school physician

the authorities feel that they would get the best results in having a designated officer to attend to these cases.

It was pointed out that many school districts have such physicians, paying them a small retaining fee to diagnose cases brought to them and to look after the necessary health cautions of the schools.

Action at this time is not being hurried because of the diphtheria scare in Bunker Hill, said Wilson Kaufman this morning, but the measure is one that has been considered by some members for quite a time.

### BULLET FROM HEART

Physician Performs Extraordinary Operation on Shrapnel Victim

(By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.)

BERLIN, Oct. 8.—The opening of a chamber in the heart and extracting a bullet is reported by Prof. Freund and Dr. Casperson in the current number of Munich Medical Weekly. The patient was a young soldier who had recovered from a bullet wound through the liver. Upon X-ray examination preceding his discharge from the hospital a foreign object was discerned in the heart. It moved synchronously with the heart's pulsations, and the physicians decided that it was a shrapnel bullet.

To prevent possible dangerous complications it was determined to remove the bullet. The breast was opened, the pericardium slit sufficiently to permit the heart to be brought forward, a quick incision was made in the right ventricle and the bullet was immediately found and removed. Much blood was lost, but the bleeding stopped after prompt stitching, and the patient made a complete recovery.
