REPEAL BIG ISSUE

PORT OF Bandon WILL HAVE LESS AMOUNT OF BONDS

Will Rescind Former Action and Make Total Only Fifty Thousand Dollars

The commissioners of the Port of Bandon at their last meeting decided to cut down the bond issue of that port. The port has voted for an issue of \$250,000 in bonds but a resolution has been passed instructing the port attorneys to prepare an ordinance repealing the present ordinance and providing for an issue of not to exceed \$50,000 in sums of \$25,000 at a time.

It appears that there were some objections to the larger bond issue and that in consequence the commissioners decided to repeal the old ordinance and have a smaller issue.
