ASKS FOR DAMAGES

J. M. FARRISS, OF COQUILLE, SUES FOR \$500.

Claimed Character Was Defamed in Connection With Bledsoe Building Fire Last August

Five hundred dollars damages for defamation of his character is asked for in a suit which has been filed by J. M. Farriss, a meat cutter of Coquille, against Harriet Bledsoe, K. P. Clark and W. Donaldson. The case arises out of the burning of the Bledsoe building on Front street in August, after which there were, it is said, circulated some stories about silverware being missed from the place. In referring to the case, the Coquille Valley Sentinel says:

"In his complaint Mr. Farriss avers that he is an expert butcher and meat cutter by trade and as such held a position in Miller's Sanitary Market. Also that to injure him in his good name, fame and reputation and cause him to be held up to public scorn and contempt, the defendants named above did wilfully, wickedly and malevolently conspire to circulate false and defamatory stories derogatory to his character and reputation.

He charges that they went to Mr. Miller, his employer, accused him of being a tramp and said that he was secreting silverware to prevent it from being used in a grand jury investigation. They even said he had stolen the silverware and that he had a suit case filled with it in his room, and was about to be arrested for the crime.

"Farriss also avers that they so persistently circulated the reports that he was a tramp and an undesirable citizen that he lost his situation and has been unable to secure another.

"For the loss of employment he demands damages in the sum of \$75; and for the mental anguish he has suffered and the pain, humiliation and disgrace to which he has been subjected, and for his loss of association with good people he wants \$425 more, or a total of \$500.

"It remains to add that when the Sheriff examined that suitcase which figures so prominently in this story he found a butcher knife and a package of envelopes."

Small Water Pipes

PRACTICALLY all complaints of poor water pressure are due to small and poorly placed water pipe in the house or building. Do you know that the flow of water through 3/4-inch pipe is more than 2 1/2 times that flowing through 1/2-inch pipe and that the cost for the larger pipe is only about 20 per cent more? If you have poor pressure at one faucet and good pressure at another, you may be sure the house piping is at fault. Insist on your plumber using 3/4-inch galvanized standard weight pipe, or larger, in your next plumbing work. See that all water pipe ends and fittings are reamed free from all burrs and that all shut-off cocks are full roundway. Have a roundway stop and waste cock at some convenient point so that you can shut off the entire water supply at any time.
