

Insist on your plumber using 3-1-inch galvanized standard See that weight pipe, or larger, in your next plumbing work. all water pipe ends and fittings are reamed free from all burrs and that all shut-off cocks are full roundway. Have a roundway slop and waste cock at some convenient point so that you can shut off the entire water supply at any time.
