Thanksgiving Pumpkin Pie.
 In the "Women's Home Companion" Fannie Merritt Farmer, cookery editor of that publication, presented a number of November recipes, among which is the following for pumpkin pie:
 "Mix two-thirds cupful of brown sugar, one teaspoonful of cinnamon, one-half teaspoonful of ginger and one-half teaspoonful of salt, and add one and one-half cupfuls of steamed and strained pumpkin, two eggs, slightly beaten, one and one-half cupfuls of milk and one-half cupful of cream. Bake in one crust."
