ADELINE IN GALE

WIND OFF CAPE MENDOCINO BLOWS CLOSE TO 90 MILES

Capt. Olson Delighted With Quick Turning of Big Span—Buoy Is Still in Breakers

Before the Adeline had time to whistle and within the space of two minutes the big draw span of the North Bend bridge swung open this morning. "Better than any Portland bridge, and quicker too," said Capt. B. W. Olson, who was highly elated over the manner of its working.

On the trip south to Oakland the Adeline faced into a sou'west gale that off Cape Mendocino howled at the rate of 85 and 90 miles an hour, delaying the vessels arrival 13 hours. But despite this Capt. Olson says the ship still sticks to the five days schedule.

He found the black buoy adrift, some 200 feet north of the jetty, probably with its chain foul on something. The Manzanita will come to put the buoy back in place. The vessel will sail at 2 p. m. tomorrow.
