**VETERAN A CITIZEN**

**JOHN KEEFE, AFTER 71 YEARS IN U. S. IS GRANTED PAPERS**

**Civil War Veteran Came Here From Ireland When Six Weeks Old—Former Page to Lincoln**

John Keefe, of Haynes Inlet, for 71 years a resident in the United States yesterday took the oath of allegiance and was granted his citizenship papers before Judge Coke at Coquille.

"How long have you lived in this country?" asked the judge.

"Seventy one years," came the reply, and it developed that Mr. Keefe was born in Ireland and came here with his parents when but six weeks old.

He held up his papers, showing an honorable discharge from the United States army, having served in the Civil War, through which he fought and for which he now receives a pension.

Mr. Keefe at one time was a page for President Abraham Lincoln, and again acted as a trusted messenger in taking correspondence between the Secretary of War and the Secretary of the Treasury. The old G. A. R. veteran is still hale and hearty and, after his admission, shook hands with Judge Coke, declaring he was mighty glad to actually be a citizen.

**Docket Is Set**

Judge Coke set a few cases for trial on Monday and several others will be set for trial as soon as the pleadings have been heard and settled. A message from Judge Skipworth, at Roseburg, says that he will not be here before January 4 to hear his cases, being detained in Douglas county until a few days before Christmas.

The old grand jury was dismissed Friday night and the new one will open for business at Coquille Monday morning.

The cases set for trial Monday are: Leach vs. Langley, Union Oil Co. vs. J. W. Flanagan and Hammond vs. Ojeda.

**PROCLAMATION**

To the People of the City of Marshfield:

I, F. E. Allen, Mayor of the City of Marshfield, Coos County, Oregon, do hereby proclaim and declare that Ordinance No. 727 of said city of Marshfield, entitled "An Ordinance directing that the question of amending Section 63 of the Charter of the City of Marshfield, enacted at the 23rd Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon in regular session for the year 1905, filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 18th, 1905, and as subsequently amended by the people of the City of Marshfield, be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Marshfield at the next regular city election"; referred to the people of said City and voted upon by them at the regular City Election of said City on the 7th day of December, 1915, held pursuant to the order of said Common Council, was duly approved by the majority of those voting at said election, that 268 votes were cast at said City Election in favor of said Ordinance and 184 votes were cast at said regular city election against said Ordinance, and that pursuant to the canvass of said votes heretofore made.

I hereby proclaim and declare said Ordinance to be in full force and effect as the Charter Amendments of the City Charter of said City of Marshfield, from the date of this proclamation.

**SUMMONS—SUIT IN EQUITY**

Notice is hereby given that sealed proposals will be received by the Finance Committee of the Common Council of the City of Marshfield, Coos County, Oregon, at the office of the City Recorder of said City of Marshfield, in the City Hall of said city until half past seven o'clock p. m. Monday, the 27th day of December, 1915, for the purchase of street improvement bonds of the said City of Marshfield, Coos County, Oregon, to the amount of \$1,223.75.

All of said improvement bonds to be in denominations not exceeding \$500.00 and bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum from the date thereof, payable semi-annually, said bonds to be dated the day of issuance and to mature in ten years thereafter, with prepayment option thereon at face value and accrued interest to date of any semi-annual coupon period at or after one year from the date of said bonds upon giving notice by publication in a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in Coos County, Oregon, such notice to be published not less than once each week for three successive weeks during the month preceding such semi-annual period at which such prepayment thereof will be made. The right is expressly reserved to reject any and all bids and upon all or any of such bids or proposals rejected, if there should remain any bonds unsold the said bonds may be thereafter sold at private sale by said Common Council of said City of Marshfield, Oregon, but in no event to be sold at less than par and accrued interest. Said bonds are authorized by the laws of the State of Oregon, and Ordinances of the City of Marshfield, Oregon.

Assessed valuation of said City of Marshfield, Oregon, is \$2,649,195.00. Bonded indebtedness is \$54,900. Population estimated at 5,900.

A certified check of five per cent of amount of bid or proposal must accompany each bid to be forfeited to said City of Marshfield, in case bid is accepted and bidder fails to accept and make payment for said bond or bonds covered thereby within ten days from the date of acceptance of said bid or bids.

Each bid or proposal submitted to designate the denomination of said bond or bonds desired.

Bid or proposals received for any amount of said bonds; small bidders given preference of purchase.

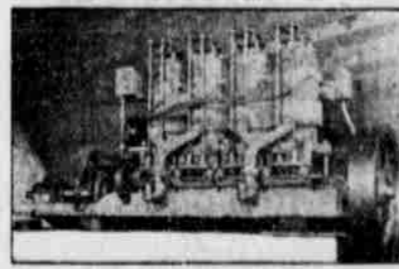
