POWERS IS CITY

Tariffs on Water, Electric Light and Power Rates Forwarded to Railroad Commission

Filing of the schedule of rates for water, electric light and power with the state railroad commission, brands Powers as a regular city. The rates are now prepared and are being forwarded by the firm of John D. Goss to the commission at Salem. G. A. Brown, of Powers, is the "corporation." He is said to have control of the water system, which was laid some time since through the streets of the platted area and into the various business houses. Also Mr. Brown is said to have an agreement with the C. A. Smith company to purchase from them the "juice" for lighting Powers and also for furnishing power, and to have control of the distributing system. The water is piped in from Bingham Creek, about three fourths of a mile above the town and has such a force that to turn it on completely would probably mean the bursting of the water pipes. The new rates for Powers are said to be approximately what they are in Marshfield.
