### GET PILING READY

TO BE DRIVEN 60 FEET FOR FOUNDATION OF BUILDING

Structure Corner Anderson and Broadway to Be Erected in Spring—Piling on Ground

Piling 60 feet in length was today being dumped by McDonald and Condon onto the lot of A. C. Going, corner Anderson and Broadway, preparatory to the starting of the modern building that next spring is to be erected there.

C. C. Going this morning stated that the driving of the piling will probably not commence for at least a month yet. They will be driven about 60 feet into the fill to make a foundation for the big building.

This lot was bought from the Ferry estate several months ago for about \$17,000 and on it will be erected one of the most modern business buildings of the city in which will be located the furniture firm of Going and Harvey.

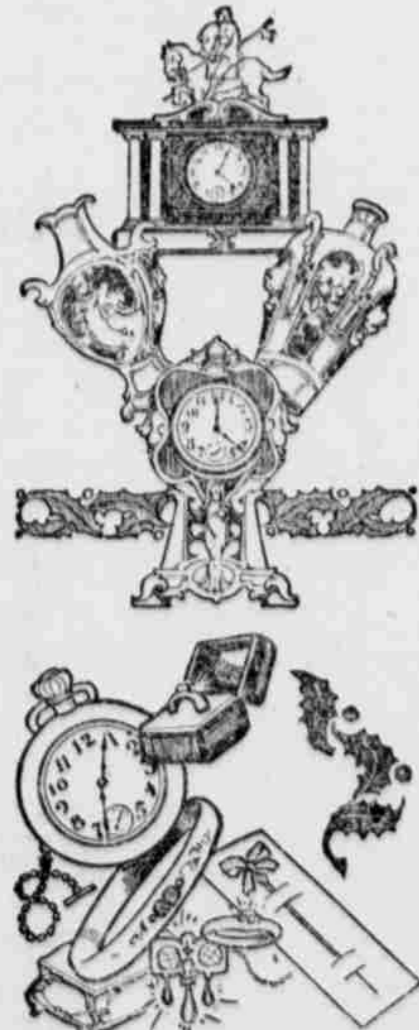
