## MAKES SUGGESTION

SCHILLER B. HERMAN WRITES FROM NEW YORK

In Letter to Judge Coke Says Coos Bay Might Have a Big Ship Building Plant

Judge John S. Coke has received a letter from Schiller B. Hermann, son of Binger Hermann, who is the president of the Northern Engineering & Construction Co. of Chicago. Mr. Hermann is now in New York and in his letter he incloses a clipping from an eastern paper telling of the great demand that there now exists for vessels.

"Even in the heyday of the shipbuilding industry in America the demand for tonnage in the foreign trade, both steam and sail, did not equal the demand at the present, and the rates now being for deep water voyages are the highest ever known. Many ship owners are taking advantage of the unprecedented demand and are disposing of their vessels. The prices which have been paid for some fairly aged craft are slightly in excess of their original cost."

Mr. Hermann ends up with a very good suggestion. He says: "Why not Coos Bay distinguish herself by a large shipbuilding plant?"

## PROSPECTS GOOD

EXPECT BANDON MILLS TO START SOON

Matter of Securing Logs Is Now the Most Important Problem to Solve

That the mills at Bandon will soon start seems to be the opinion of the Bandon Recorder which says:

The prospects for the early operation of the local mills seem encouraging. John Yoakum, receiver for the Cody Lumber Co., who is in charge of its affairs and has the custody of the logs cut by that company on the Coach tract, has received a bid for the logs pursuant to his advertisement, calling for bids. Before the court would make an order directing the receiver to accept a bid, he required that A. J. Sherwood and clients opposing the receivership had should first express themselves as satisfied with the conditions of proposed sale and with the amount of the bid, which for some reason they declined to do, but instead asked the court for 15 days extension of time in which to re-advertise in the hope that they would receive higher and better bids, which application was granted by the court.

Receiver John Yoakum must therefore delay for that time any action in the way of closing up the deal.

The matter of the local mills starting seems to be rather a question of getting logs, but loggers and mill men seem to be busily engaged in conferences these days and Bandon may be justified in looking for operations, about as soon as the formalities of court and other necessary delays can be disposed of.
