The Coos River School lost a day of school, the first of the year, last Monday as a result of the freshet on Coos River.

The rain gauge at the Coos River school showed 6.6 inches of rainfall during Saturday, Sunday and Monday.

The water reached its highest about midnight on Sunday. The river commenced to rise Saturday night and kept up until Monday morning, reaching thirty feet above normal.

The water came up to the doors of many Coos River people and some had to move out. Nearly everyone had their boat tied to their front gate, and some were up all night Sunday watching their belongings.

The actual damage done was not great. At Daniels Creek about a thousand feet of this logging rail road track was washed out.

While this was the biggest freshet for several years it did not equal some that Coos River has known. Eight years ago the water was two feet higher at Justrom's place, though the damage was no greater than this year.

The school received a small fraction of its annual library order this week. The original order included ten sets of supplementary readers of 20 books each for the grades.
