Mrs. Johnson, whose maiden name was Anna Halls, was born near the village of Gosely, Suffolk County, England, June 6th, 1878.

weeks after he landed on the Western Continent he, with two-year-old Robert, was laid in its bosom.

She had taught several terms of country school, about the only outlet for a girl's ambition in those days, and was known as an occasional contributor to county and state papers.

When they were no longer dependent upon her care, she became a regular correspondent of the Michigan Farmer, and Detroit Free Press.

From this group of eight or ten ladies, who met in her home once a month, the suggestion spread and similar societies became scattered about the state from which the hospital received considerable help.

In 1897 she came with her family to Oregon City, where they lived till 1903 when they settled in North Bend.

After coming west she sent back descriptive letters entitled: "Western Gossip," which proved of much interest to the many whose attention was turned to this country.

Of that little English household, she was last to go. Matthew, the eldest, died in 1873, just as he had fitted himself to enter the Ministry of the M. E. church.
