Boat Is Started.—Work has been started at the F. L. Lowe Shipyard on the hull of the 40 foot boat for the Coos River Transportation Company. The craft is to be finished for early summer travel. A 60 horsepower engine will be installed.

Campfire Girls Meet.—Tomorrow afternoon at 2:15 the Campfire Girls are to meet at the Guild Hall where Mrs. Clarence E. Ash will talk to them on the subject of "Birds" if the day is at all pleasant the girls will be taken for a walk in the woods so that they may get acquainted first hand with the members of the feathered tribe. Orators Out Tonight.—The inter-high school oratorical contest of Coos county is to be held this evening at 8 p. m. in the Marshfield high school auditorium. There will be 11 entries from the six high schools of the county. The judges will be the city school superintendents including, C. A. Howard, Coquille; L. W. Turnbull, Bandon; E. L. Coe, North Bend; Eugene Smith, Myrtle Point, and F. A. Tiedgen Marshfield.

Is in Dire Trouble.—Word here states that the gasoline schooner Ahweneda, owned by Capt. Morse, of Newport, and formerly plying between Portland, the Umpqua and Bandon and Coquille, is in dire distress off Bay view. It is said that she has drifted in close to the shore where such a high sea is breaking that the Coast Guard crew had a difficult time to get out to them. The boat may be a total loss.
