

Arno Mercen, of the C. A. Smith Company, Returns From San Francisco

Due to the uncertainties of the present negotiations with Germany the lumber market is not quite as strong right now as it was a month ago, is the report of Arno Mereen, of the C. A. Smith company, who returned yesterday afternoon, via train, from San Francisco.

He says that because of the unsettled conditions builders are holding fearing to enlarge and expand until they can see what is going to happen, However, Mr. Mereen said that the company is able to place the output of the mills quite readily and that the resumption of the six day schedule is dependent upon the logging situation.


