OREGON RETAILERS HOWEVER WILL MEET IN PORTLAND

Effort Was Made to Secure the 1917 Convention for Coos Bay But Not Accepted

The Oregon Retail Merchants Association which was in session at Astoria was invited to come to Marshfield in 1917 but it was decided by the delegates to hold the meeting in Portland.

Referring to the invitation from Marshfield the Morning Astorian says: Marshfield is making a strong bid for the convention and yesterday the following telegram was received from the Coos Bay Retail Merchants association:

"Coos Bay cordially calls to the Oregon Retail Merchants association to hold its convention here next year. A warm welcome, big clam bake, and honest hospitality awaits you. All Southwest Oregon joins in this invitation, with the assurance that the interests of the association, as well as the pleasure of its delegates will be well served by acceptance. Come." This invitation was signed by Tom Harvey, president; Earl Powell, secretary; and M. C. Maloney, a member of the executive committee, of the Coos County association.

The invitation is being looked upon with favor and may be accepted with Marshfield as the city for the 1917 gathering. It is said that other Oregon cities also desire the convention.
