Coquille Firm Gets Order From Points in East

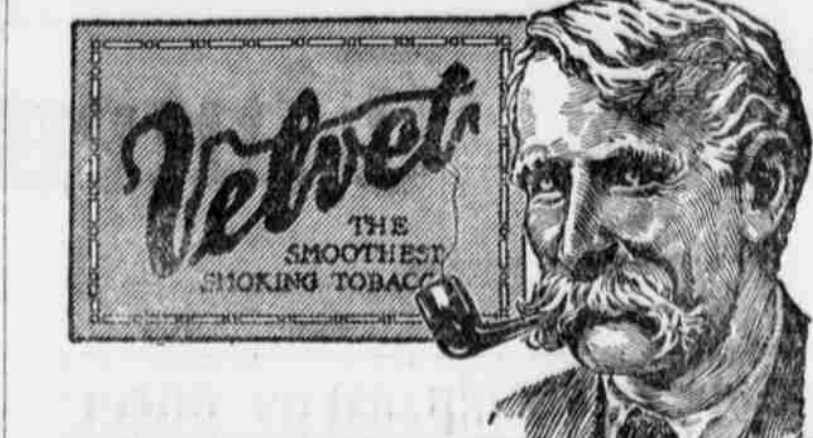
