The three men are supposed to have attempted to enter Mexico.

HOTEL IS BURNED

MARSHFIELD HOTEL IN FLAMES WHEN OIL STOVE EXPLODES

Explosion of an oil stove in the Marshfield Hotel, corner Third and Commercial, during the noon hour, sent a flame of terror that gutted the entire building so suddenly the occupants fled terror stricken for their lives. No one was injured, though practically everything within the structure was destroyed.

LOST EVERYTHING IN BLAZE

She presented a pitiful picture as she stood weeping out on the curbing, watching everything she owned, go up in smoke. "And it has been such a hard time for us," she said. "We worked awfully hard to get started and thought that things would break right for us now."

STAYED WITH TRUNK

They lost everything today, with the exception of what was in a trunk. Mr. Melrose hauled this down the front stairs, hanging fast to it though the fire swirled so close his mustache and hair were badly singed.

WATER PRESSURE GOOD

R. H. Corey, of the water company, heard the bell, and hurried to the spot. A hydrant on the hotel corner was opened and this furnished a husky stream before the fire engine arrived and a second hose was connected up. The water pressure throughout was very good. The firemen responded quickly and did very efficient work. Had it not been for their hasty efforts the flames might have been fanned through the surrounding residence district.

LOSS NOT ESTIMATED

The Marshfield Hotel building formerly stood at the corner of Front and Commercial and is historically well known. It was about 40 years old and was owned at the present time by the Elks lodge, standing on the corner owned by them.
