### October Term of County Court.

WEDNESDAY, OCT. 4TH.

County Court for the transaction of county business convened at the court house in Toledo on Wednesday, October 4th, with members present, to-wit: D. P. Blue, Judge, presiding; J. O. Stearns and M. L. Trapp, commissioners; B. F. Jones, county clerk and G. A. Landis, sheriff. The following proceedings were had:

In the matter of the settlement of Virgil E. Watters, with Lincoln county; Settlement made and warrant ordered drawn in favor of Virgil E. Watters in the sum of \$1,315 in payment of balance due on transcribing contract, making total warrants drawn to the amount of \$5,500 for such work.

In the matter of the canvass of the election returns of the election held at town of Toledo; Now at this day came on for the consideration of the court the canvass of the vote of the election held in the town of Toledo, Lincoln County, Oregon, on Monday, the 11th day of September 1893, pursuant to notice of said election published by order of the county court of said county and state as by law required, said election to be held for the purpose of voting for or against the incorporation of the proposed city of Toledo and for the election of officers thereof. And it appearing to the court that said election was conducted in all respects in accordance with the general election laws of the state and that at said election the majority of the votes are for incorporation; It is therefore ordered that the following described boundaries be and are hereby duly incorporated as a municipal corporation under the name and style of the city of Toledo, to-wit: Commencing at the northeast corner of Bensell & William's addition to the town of Toledo, Lincoln county, Oregon, running thence south to a point 150 feet north from the northwest corner of the S. W. 1/4 of the S. E. 1/4 of Sec. 17, T. 11 S., R. 10 west, thence east to the center of Olalla slough, thence down the center of said slough to the O. P. R. R. right-of-way, thence westerly along the north line of said right-of-way to a point 60 feet south from the line between the land claims of John Graham and J. T. Vincent, thence west to the center of Depot slough, thence up the center of said slough to the intersection of line between sections 17 and 18, thence north on said section line to the north line of Thirteenth (13) street, thence east on said line of street to T. P. Fish's addition, thence due north to the northwest corner of Bensell & William's addition, thence east to place of beginning.
