**County Court.**  
 In the matter of the petition of F. M. Carter, et al. for the establishing of county road: Ordered that Huston Parks, R. A. Miller and Henry Palmer be appointed viewers to meet with the county surveyor on Dec. 20, 1893, or within five days thereafter, at Elk City and view said road.

In the matter of constructing a county bridge across the Yaquina river at Chitwood: It appearing that all previous conditions having been complied with, it was ordered that warrants be issued in payments of material therein to the amount of \$292.30.

In the matter of the Newport and Siletz county road: Continued to the regular Feb. term for further consideration.

In the matter of the petition of Henry Lewis praying for issuing of a warrant for \$23.25 to take place of warrant lost. Petition granted.

In the matter of Chambers road on Big Elk. Continued till February term.

In the matter of the Toledo and Fall Creek road: Continued until February term.

In the matter of the petition of Albert Meaker et al: Petition not allowed.

In the matter of application of Louise Leuenberg for free scholarship in the state agricultural college: Action deferred.

Ordered that the sheriff be and is hereby instructed to dispose of the unused brick, property of the county and pay the proceeds into the county fund taking the receipts of the county treasurer therefor.

Ordered that the court stand adjourned until the first Wednesday in January 1894.

We have received several communications concerning the indictment of the Jobs and Davis. These communications are all sensible, forceful and entirely void of objectionable features, and yet we are constrained not to publish them for this reason: The LEADER felt that its solemn duty was to expose as much of the rottenness of that affair as came within its knowledge. This it did and a grand jury of seven honest and true men assisted by the prosecuting attorney, one of the ablest attorneys in the state, have vindicated our course and indicted the parties in the case. The matter is now in the court, in whose probity and integrity we have implicit confidence. We believe that the accused will have a fair and impartial trial and it is not our desire to say any thing that might be construed by the defense to be an attempt to create a prejudice against them. For this reason the LEADER desires to say nothing more at present.

As to the gratuitous insults which have been offered to the grand jury and our people generally they amount to nothing, are their own refutation and are not worth answering.
