Commissioners Court.
The commissioner's court have established voting precincts as follows:

NASHVILLE PRECINCT NO. 7.
It is hereby ordered that a separate voting and justice of the peace precinct to be known as Nashville Precinct No. 7, be and is hereby created to be bounded as follows: Commencing at the southwest corner of township 11, range 8, thence west to southeast corner of section 30, town 11 range 8; thence west to southwest corner of section 6, town 11, range 8; thence north to section standard parallel; thence west to southwest corner of section 31, town 10, range 8; thence north to Polk county line; thence east to Benton county line; thence south to second standard parallel; thence east to northeast corner of township 11, range 8; thence south to the place of beginning. That the polling place of said district be fixed at the Hamar school house near Nashville.

NEWPORT PRECINCT NO. 8.
Ordered that a separate voting and justice of the peace precinct be created to be known as Newport Precinct No. 8, and be bounded as follows: Commencing at the northeast corner of section 21, town 10, range 11; thence south to second standard parallel; thence east to northeast corner of section 4, town 11, range 11; thence south to meander line of Yaquina Bay; thence westerly along meander line of Yaquina bay to center line running north and south of section 9, town 11, range 11; thence south to northwest corner of southeast quarter of section 33, town 11, range 11; thence west to northwest corner of section 4, town 11, range 11; thence due south along said section lines to Beaver creek; thence westerly following the course of Beaver creek to the Pacific ocean; thence northerly along the ocean beach to northeast corner of section 20, town 10, range 11; thence east to place of beginning. The voting place of said precinct is fixed at the city council rooms in the city of Newport.

ELK CITY PRECINCT NO. 11.
Ordered that a separate voting and justice of the peace precinct be created to be known as Elk City Precinct No. 11, and be bounded as follows: Commencing at the southeast corner of section 35, town 11, range 10; thence south to southeast corner of section 9, town 11, range 9; thence north to northwest corner of section 21, town 11, range 9; thence west to southwest corner of section 18, town 11, range 9; thence north to second standard parallel; thence west to southwest corner of section 31, town 10, range 9; thence north to northeast corner of section 24, town 10, range 10; thence west to northwest corner of section 22, town 10, range 10; thence south to southwest corner of section 34, town 10, range 10; thence east to northwest corner of section 3, town 11, range 10; thence south to place of beginning. The voting place of said district shall be at the public school house at Elk City.

LOWER ALSEA PRECINCT NO. 13.
It is hereby ordered that a separate voting and joint justice of the peace precinct be and is hereby created to be known as Lower Alsea Precinct No. 13, and be bounded as follows: Beginning at the intersection of Beaver creek with the Pacific ocean; thence easterly following the course of Beaver creek and North Beaver creek to the east line of township 12 south, range 11 west; thence along township line to the southeast corner of township 12 south, range 11 west; thence east to southwest corner of section 3, town 13 south, range 10 west; thence south to northeast corner of section 24, town 13 south, range 11 west; thence south to southeast corner of section 36, township 13 south, range 11 west; thence east to northeast corner of section 1, town 14 south, range 11 west; thence south to southeast corner of section 1, town 14 south, range 11 west; thence west to southwest corner of section 6, township 14 south, range

11 west; thence south to Lane county line; thence west along Lane county line to Pacific ocean; thence northerly along ocean beach to place of beginning. That the polling place of said precinct be hereby fixed at the Waldport school house.

TOLEDO PRECINCT NO. 14.
Ordered that a separate voting and justice of the peace precinct be and is hereby created to be known as Toledo Precinct No. 14, and to be bounded as follows: Commencing at the northeast corner of section 31, town 10 south, range 10 west; thence south to second standard parallel; thence east to northeast corner of section 4, town 11 south, range 10 west; thence south to southwest corner of section 15, town 12 south, range 10 west; thence west to northeast corner of section 24, town 12 south, range 11 west; thence in a northerly direction along township line to the southwest corner of township 11 south, range 10 west; thence west to southwest corner of section 36, town 11 south, range 11 west; thence west to southwest corner of section 36, township 11 south, range 11 west; thence north to northwest corner of section 1, town 11 south, range 11 west; thence west to southwest corner of section 36, town 10 south, range 11 west; thence north to northwest corner of section 24, town 10 south, range 11 west; thence east to place of beginning. That the polling place of said district be and is hereby fixed at the Court House in said district.

TIDEWATER PRECINCT NO. 15.
Ordered that a separate voting and justice of the peace precinct be and is hereby created to be known as Tidewater Precinct No. 15, and to be bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the northwest corner of section 19, town 13 south, range 10 west; thence east to northeast corner of section 21, town 13 south, range 10 west; thence north to northwest corner of section 3, town 13 south, range 10 west; thence south to northeast corner of section 22, town 13 south, range 9 west; thence east to northeast corner of section 24, town 13 south, range 9 west; thence south to Lane county line; thence west along Lane county line to the dividing line between sections 9 and 10, town 13 south, range 10 west; thence north to northwest corner of section 22, town 14 south, range 10 west; thence west to southwest corner of section 18, town 14 south, range 10 west; thence north to third standard parallel; thence west to southwest corner of section 31, town 13 south, range 10 west; thence north to place of beginning. That the voting place of said precinct be and is hereby fixed at School House in school district No. 55, situated therein.

YAQUINA PRECINCT NO. 16.
Ordered that a separate voting and justice of the peace precinct be and is hereby created to be known as Yaquina Precinct No. 16, and to be bounded as follows: Commencing at the northeast corner of section 23, town 10 south, range 11 west; thence south to second standard parallel; thence east to northeast corner of section 2, town 11 south, range 11 west; thence south to southeast corner of section 35, town 11 south, range 11 west; thence east to southeast corner of section 36, town 11 south, range 11 west; thence south to where the north fork of Beaver creek intersects the east line of township 12 south, range 11 west, near the southeast corner of section 13, town 12 south, range 11 west; thence westerly following the course of North Beaver creek to the west line of section 21, town 12 south, range 11 west; thence north along said section line to the northwest corner of lot 3, section 4, town 12 south, range 11 west; thence east to the southwest corner of southeast quarter, section 33, town 11 south, range 11 west; thence north to north meander line of Yaquina bay; thence easterly along said meander line to the section line between sections 9 and 10, town 11 south, range 11 west; thence north to second standard

parallel; thence west to southwest corner of section 34, town 10 south, range 11 west; thence north to northwest corner of section 22, town 10 south, range 11 west; thence east to place of beginning. That the polling place of said precinct be and is hereby fixed at Jacob & Neungass' store building in Yaquina City.

LITTLE ELK PRECINCT NO. 17.
Ordered that a separate voting and justice of the peace precinct, to be known as Little Elk Precinct No. 17, be and is hereby created and that the boundaries thereof be fixed and described as follows: Commencing at the northwest corner of section 10, town 10 south, range 9 west; thence running east to northeast corner of section 24, town 10 south, range 9 west; thence south to second standard parallel; thence east to northeast corner of section 1, town 11 south, range 9 west; thence south to southeast corner of section 1, town 11 south, range 9 west; thence east to northeast corner of section 21, town 11 south, range 8 west; thence south to southeast corner of section 21, town 11 south of range 8 west; thence west to southwest corner of section 21, town 11 south of range 9 west; thence north to northwest corner of section 21, town 11 south of range 9 west; thence west to southwest corner of section 18, township eleven south of range nine west; thence north to second standard parallel; thence west to southwest corner of section 31, town 10 south of range 9 west; thence north to place of beginning. That the voting place of said district be and is hereby fixed at Little Elk school house at Little Elk.

DRIFT CREEK PRECINCT NO. 18.
Ordered that a separate voting precinct be and is hereby created to be known as Drift Creek Precinct No. 18, and to be bounded and described as follows: Commencing at the southwest corner of section 34, town 11 south, range 10; thence east to southeast corner of section 35, town 11 south, range 10 west; thence south to southeast corner of section 11, town 12, range ten west; thence east to southwest corner of section 11, town 12 south, range 9 west; thence south to southeast corner of section 35, town 12 south, range 9 west; thence south to southeast corner of section 35, town 12 south, range 9 west; thence west to southwest corner of section 12, town 12 south, range 11 west; thence east to southwest corner of section 15, town 12 south, range 10 west; thence north to place of beginning. That the above described precinct be annexed to Toledo Precinct No. 14, for justice of the peace purposes. That the polling place thereof be fixed at the School House in school district No. 88, situated therein.

BIG ELK PRECINCT NO. 21.
Ordered that a separate voting and justice of the peace precinct be and is hereby created, to be known as Big Elk Precinct No. 21, and that the boundaries thereof be fixed and described as follows: Commencing at the northeast corner of township 12, range 8; thence west to northeast corner of section 3, town 12, range 8; thence north to northeast corner of section 28, town 11, range 8; thence west to northeast corner of section 29, town 11, range 9; thence south to southwest corner of section 9, town 12, range 9; thence east to southwest corner of section 11, town 12, range 9; thence south to southeast corner of section 15, town 13, range 9; thence east to Benton county line; thence north to place of beginning.
