The County Printing.

It is disagreeable to the LEADER to engage in a personal fight or to publish his personal troubles to the people, but in the matter of the decision of the county court regarding the county printing for the current year it deems itself justified in making a statement of the facts in the matter, which are these:

The statute provides that in the January session of the county court they shall determine on an official paper for the year. This matter is determined in the following manner: Every paper in the county which desires the county printing must file with the county court at its January term a sworn list of its bona fide annual subscribers living within the county, and the paper having the largest list shall be designated as the official county paper.

When the county court of Lincoln county met in January last the LEADER presented a list of subscribers duly sworn to. No other list was presented. The county court then made the following order in the matter:

"In the matter of the letting of the county printing, the Yaquina Bay News and Yaquina Post having failed to file their subscription list, the matter was deferred until the February term."

Thus it will be seen that the Yaquina Bay News and the Yaquina Post were given a month more to rustle subscribers in than the LEADER had. When the matter came up in the February term the Yaquina Bay News did not file a list of subscribers. The Post did, but did not positively swear to the list, so the court kindly gave him more time to prepare his list. When the list was finally sworn to, the county and state in which the subscribers lived were omitted. At the Toledo postoffice he claims 74 subscribers, which perhaps is nearly correct. At Newport postoffice he claims 100 subscribers. The Post seems to be very popular at Newport. His list there is such a wonderful thing that we give it as it was sworn to. It is as follows:

Of course some of them are dead, some have been gone for a long time and fully two-thirds of them never subscribed for the Post at all. The list at Waldport, Ona, Lutjens and Yaquina is fully as badly stuffed.

The court, in defiance of objections made by the editor of the

LEADER, awarded the printing to the Post, it claiming 363 subscribers in the county as against the LEADER'S 299. The case was appealed from the county court and will be brought up for the district court to decide.

We will now see whether the element that has been bucking the LEADER so hard for some time will not get a perfect sufficiency of it by the time they get through.

County Court.

The regular February term of county court convened at Toledo on the 6th. The following proceedings were had:

In the matter of the report of J. E. Allen, supervisor of road district No. 57: Report accepted, and his claim allowed in the sum of \$54.90; J. R. Allen re-appointed.

In the matter of rebuilding the Elk City bridge: Ordered that the clerk advertise for bids by posting notices at the postoffices in Elk City, Yaquina, Newport and Toledo.

In the matter of the report of W. B. Mulkey, supervisor of road district No. 44: Report accepted and claim of \$20 allowed in full; W. B. Mulkey re-appointed; and it is further ordered that the said supervisor be instructed and authorized to open a piece of road in said district.

In the matter of Huston Parks, supervisor of road district No. 25: Report accepted and claim of \$20 allowed in full; supervisor re-appointed.

In the matter of the report of John McCullom, supervisor of road district No. 10: Report accepted and claim of \$51.20 allowed; supervisor re-appointed.

In the matter of the report of I. J. Pepin, supervisor of road district No. 50: Report accepted and claim of \$10 allowed; L. F. Pepin appointed supervisor for the year 1895.

In the matter of the report of Geo. Buford, supervisor of road district No. 38: Report accepted and claim of \$47.50 allowed in full; David Williams appointed supervisor.

In the matter of the report of Jas. McDonald, supervisor of road district No. 32: Report accepted and claim for \$16 allowed in full; E. W. Powers appointed supervisor for 1895.

In the matter of the report of A. T. Peterson, supervisor of road district No. 34: Report accepted and claim of \$59 allowed in full; supervisor re-appointed.

In the matter of the report of Albert Meaker, supervisor of road district No. 46: Report accepted and claim of \$48 allowed in full; J. M. K. Butler appointed supervisor.

In the matter of the report of W. L. Dwyre, supervisor of road district No. 55: Report accepted and claim of \$26 allowed; O. Nelson appointed supervisor.

In the matter of the report of Geo. Hodge, supervisor of road district No. 56: Report accepted and claim for \$20 allowed in full; Frank Thompson appointed for 1895.

In the matter of the report of W. F. Hyde, supervisor of district No. 33: Report accepted and claim for \$23.50 allowed in full; Ben Hunt appointed for 1895.

Report of Chris. Hansen, supervisor of road district No. 45, adopted and claim for \$42 allowed; C. Linderman appointed for 1895.

Report of Fred Joss, supervisor of district No. 45, accepted and claim of \$38 allowed in full; Wm. Dobson appointed for 1895.

Report of Lucius Norton, supervisor of road district No. 8, adopted and claim for \$10 allowed in full and L. Norton re-appointed for 1895.

Report of T. N. Coombs, supervisor of road district No. 47: report accepted and claim for \$32 allowed in full; Sam Hill appointed for 1895.

Robert Chambers appointed supervisor of road district No. 17, for 1895.

In the matter of the granting a liquor license to W. H. Huntsucker: License granted with J. M. Bowers and Jno. Priest, bondsmen.

In the matter of the petition of J. T. Vincent to vacate streets in Vincent's addition to Toledo; con-

tinued for the term.

In the matter of the county printing for the year 1895: Now on this 8th day of February 1895, comes on to be heard the matter of letting the contract for county printing for 1895, and it appearing that the Yaquina Post had the largest circulation of any paper in Lincoln county, Oregon; it is therefore ordered and adjudged by the court that the Yaquina Post have and is hereby designated as the official paper for the year 1895, and that the price to be paid by the county shall not exceed the sum of twenty-five cents per square of ten lines of brier type, newspaper measurement, or its equivalent. Whereupon J. F. Stewart asked the court to have the privilege of filing objections to the letting of said contract to the Yaquina Post; and the objections were duly filed.

In the matter of filling a vacant scholarship in the Agricultural college: Geo. B. McCluskey appointed to said scholarship by lot. Samuel Case was allowed an exemption of \$300 to apply on 1893 assessment.

In the matter of creating road district No. 4, on Wright's creek: Road district created as follows: Beginning at N. W. corner of S. W. 1/4 section 9, town 11 south, range 10 west; thence east to N. E. corner of S. E. 1/4 section 29, town 11, range 10; thence south to S. E. corner of section 8, town 12, range 10; thence west to S. E. corner of section 12; thence north to S. E. corner of section 1, town 12, range 11; thence west to S. W. corner of S. E. 1/4 of S. E. 1/4 of section 3, town 12, range 11; thence north to Yaquina Bay; thence along said Bay to place of beginning.

In the matter of establishing a voting and justice of the peace precinct at the Siletz reservation: Petition of U. S. Grant and 59 others asking that a justice of the peace and voting precinct be established to be composed of the territory included in the Siletz Indian reservation: It is ordered that a justice of the peace and voting precinct be established to be composed of all the territory included within the boundaries of said reservation, and that U. S. Grant be appointed justice of the peace for said district, and Oscar B. Brown be appointed constable.

In the matter of creating road districts on the Siletz reservation, it was ordered that road districts No. 1, 2, and 3 be created as follows: District No. 1 to include all of section 9, town 10, range 10, and the territory lying south of said section 9, in town 10, range 10. District No. 2 shall include the territory in town 10, ranges 9 and 10, lying east of section 9, town 10, range 10. District No. 3 to include all territory lying north of the north boundary of section 9, town 10, range 10. Antone Selsic was appointed supervisor for district No. 1, H. C. Callahan for district No. 2, and John Abbott for district No. 3.

In the matter of the delinquent tax rolls for the years 1889-90-91-92-93, the clerk was authorized to issue to the sheriff an alias warrant authorizing and commanding him to collect the taxes assessed on said rolls; and that the said sheriff shall collect a penalty of three per cent for the first 30 days and five per cent thereafter until the warrant is returned to the clerk, the said penalties to defray the cost of collecting. Court adjourned for term.
