Dairy Notes.

S. O. Morford's creamery, leased to Andrew Gibson, is now turning out 56 pounds of butter per day which sells at 25 cents per pound. Seventy cows are being milked at present and 20 heifers will come in soon. The milk averages a test of 4 per cent. Alfalfa hay is the principal feed. This year 15 acres will be planted to carrots. Forty calves are being raised on separator milk.—Yakima Farmer.

He leaves this morning to visit the Cascade locks, and have a look at the dalles and the site of the proposed boat railway, and will take the east-bound train at The Dalles this evening.
