A. Popular Seaside Resort. The Evening Telegram of Portand publishes the tollowing article concerning Yaquina Bay and the Oregon Central \& Eastern railroad: One of the most beautiful rides in Oregon is over the Oregon Central \& Eastern railroad from Albany and Corvallis over the Coast Range mountains to Yaquina City and Newport. Passengers can leave Portland on the Roseburg train, of he East Side division of the Southern Pacific system, at $\mathrm{s}: 30$ , m., arriving at Albany at noon. The O. C. \& E. train leaves Al bany at $1: 30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. Passengers can also leave Portland at 7:30 on the West Side division of the S. P. railway for Corvallis, arriving there at $12: 30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. The Oregon Central \& Eastern train leaves Corvallis at $1,50 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$., reaching Yaquina City about $6 \mathrm{p}, \mathrm{m}$. Passengers are transferred to a tug at Yaquina City and ride four miles to Newport, landing there at $6: 30 \mathrm{p}$. m. The Oregon Central \& Eastern railway has one of the best ballasted roads in the country. All the bridges are being rebuilt along the line. The woods look very pretty at this time of the year with their fir clad hills, and the flowers in the mountains are especially attractive. Yaquina Bay is becoming one of the most favorite beaches in the West. Most of the people that go there are from the towns and country south of Portland. There are to jetties, one on the north and the other on the south of the Bay. The Oregon Central \& Eastern has a line of steamers ruming on the Willamette from Portland to Albany and Corvallis, contrecting with the trains at these points. Vaquina Bay is fast becoming a commercial Oysters, bass, cod, kelp and halibut are caught there in lugequanie. The mountains in then ne mountain in that vicinity other , en, pigeon and other game. Grain, grasses, fruits, and vegetables are raised along the railroad line in large quantities and of the finest variety. The bathing at Yaquina, just inside the north jetty, and in the ocean is a great attraction for visitors.
The Oregon Central \& Eastern Railway Company expects to extend its line about 142 miles east of Abany to a connection with some Eastern road at Boise City.
