

The Best Bee Hives.

Probably the most important matter to the beginner in the bee keeping business is the kind of a hive he shall adopt, and the experience of the past is the only safe guide for him to follow, and as many beginners are asking which is the best hive, I will give my views on the subject.

In the first place every one admits that a frame hive is an absolute necessity; and all admit also that but one size or style of frame should be used in the same apiary. If the beginner doubts this, the experience of a single season will most certainly convince him that such is the case, and a single attempt to unite two colonies from different sized hives will disgust him so that he in the future will select one and stick to it.

A bee hive is a compromise between the needs of the bees and the convenience of the owner. So far as the bees are concerned any box or nail keg that keeps out the rain is good enough, but for us we want something that is simple, safe and convenient. The frame should be large enough to supply a large colony, and in such shape that it can be conveniently handled; deep enough to winter well, and so shallow that the surplus honey must of necessity be stored in the space above the frames; and long enough so that the greatest possible amount of space can be utilized for sections in which surplus honey can be stored. There are many other considerations that might be mentioned in this connection, but the above are enough for the purposes of this article. Now, what hive will fill the above bill?

In answering this question I do not propose to make a long explanation as to the whys and wherefors, but simply state my own opinions, with a few reasons therefor. The frame that I use and advise is the L frame, in a hive 14 1/4 inches wide, holding ten of these frames, or 12 inches holding eight of these frames. This opinion is based on the opinions of the veterans in apiculture, and in use in my own apiary. I have found the L frame to completely fill the wants and requirements of successful. And farther still, this is not only my own experience, but it is that of a large majority of bee keepers in this country. Statistics show that there are more L hives in use than of all others combined, and any of the hives advertised and sold under some other name carry the size of frame I use and recommend. The beginner, then, by adopting this hive will not only know that it is one most used by successful apiarists, but will know that he is working on the same line with them. But if he has occasion to buy frames of comb they will fit right into his own hives without any trouble, and if he has bees to sell he will find that a better price will be paid for them in this hive, because the purchaser can work them right into his own. Other hives do good work, and other hives might satisfy the beginner, but the facts stated above are, if accepted, sufficient, and show that the Langstroth frame is the frame for the beginner.
