The root of wild parsnip is a that eat it. They fed some to a calf out at college Thursday morndornick. It lived less than three experimenters had time to administer remedies. Yesterday morning favorite autidotes were in readiness.

In each case a bulb the shape of an apple and the size of and ordinary door knob was fed. The root was a dark reddish brown, brittle, and with a strong smell of parsnip. A third of the bottom of each bulb was covered with fleshy rootlets.

The first call was fed at eight e'clock in the morning, and at 10:45 the animal was dead. The root was subsequently found in the first and second stomachs. The second animal ate the root at ten minutes past nine in the morning. Evidences of the poison became manifest at 10:40, and the animal died at 11:45. The symptoms closely resembled the effects of strychnine poisoning. The calf staggered les of the neck were rigid. from the mouth. A tro-car inserted in the stomach allowed the escape of gas that smelled strongly of the parsuip. Among the antidotes applied in the latter case were a drenching of milk and turpentine, a hypodermic injection of nitroglycerine and a dose of aconite.

The tests were made to determine the question of whether or not wild parsnip bulbs were poisonous. They were thoroughly and scientifically successful, and dissipate any doubts that may have existed. The bulbs came from the western portion of the county, where a number of cattle that tried the diet promptly died.
