We are in receipt of Bulletin No. 44, of the Oregon Agricultural experiment station. It is a review of Oregon sugar beets, and has much valuable information concerning sugar beet culture and the making of sugar. In the tables of analysis of the sugar beets from 1891 to 1896 we find several tests made from beets grown in Lincoln county. The beets all tested high, above the average. They were as follows: C. J. Bishop, Tidewater, 14.46 per cent, sugar in juice, 13.7 sugar in beet and 73.77 purity, sugar per ton 289.2; C. L. Gowell, Toledo, sugar in juice 17.29, sugar in beet 16.1, purity 80.37, sugar per ton 345.3; T. Pavey, Yaquina, sugar in juice, 16.23, sugar in beet 14.43, purity 85.82, sugar per ton 224.6; J. H. Rosebrooks, Toledo, two samples, sugar in juice 13.68 and 13.42, sugar in beets 12.16 and 11.02, purity 74.34 and 77.57, sugar per ton 273 and 268; James Wilkinson, Beaver creek, sugar in juice 12.55, sugar in beets 11.59, purity 72.54, sugar per ton 251; Wm. Bogue, Toledo, sugar in juice 15.00, sugar in beets 14.20, purity 80.60, sugar per ton, 300; R. S. Barclay, Tidewater, sugar in juice 19.40, sugar in beet 18.40, purity 83.40, sugar per ton 388. C. J. Bishop, of Tidewater, has submitted six samples and each sample has shown a good test, the percentages given to him above being about his average. The tests of Lincoln county beets are above the average of tests made from all over the state.
