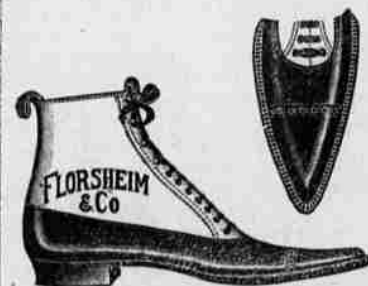

COUNTY COURT.

At the regular June term of county court held here the following proceedings were had.

In the matter of liquor license of W. H. Huntsucker: License for three months granted, dating from the 10th day of June till the 10th day of September.

In the matter of a petition of M. S. Woodcock to redeem certain real property sold for delinquent taxes, December 20, 1895: At this time came on to be heard the petition of M. S. Woodcock which shows that he is the owner of, and successor in interest to, certain real property, formerly owned by J. R. Bayley, and hereinafter described; and that said real property was sold on or about the 20th day of December, 1895, by Geo. A. Landis, sheriff of Lincoln county, Oregon, for delinquent taxes assessed against said property for the years 1892 and for the sum of \$104.53 including costs thereon and for the year 1894 for the sum of \$118.47 including costs thereon, and it further appears that in said sale was included other property which was assessed against said J. R. Bayley and in which said M. S. Woodcock has no interest, and said M. S. Woodcock by his petition proposes to pay the proportion of taxes together with all costs of sale and interest accrued thereon, which should be properly and equally proportioned according to the valuation thereof as assessed on the said property hereinafter described and in which said M. S. Woodcock is the owner and successor in interest as aforesaid, and it appearing to the court that it is for the best interest of the county to make a settlement of the taxes as proposed on said property hereinafter described, it is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed by the court, that upon payment to the county clerk of Lincoln county, Oregon, the sum Two Hundred and Fifty-five and 17-100 Dollars (\$255.17,) the same shall be and is hereby accepted in full accord and satisfaction of and in redemption of said lands from said taxes, costs and interest thereon for the years 1892, 1893 and 1894 and said real property was sold for delinquent taxes as aforesaid and for all taxes due or to become due on said real property for the years 1892, 1893 and 1894, and said real property is hereby released and fully discharged from the effects of said sale for delinquent taxes and the taxes and costs and interest thereon, which real property is more particularly described as follows, to-wit: Lots 2 and 3 in block 4; lots 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 in block 61; lots 1, 2, 3, 10, 11 and 12 in block 102; lots 7, 8 and 9 in block 44; lots 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 in block 28; lots 1, 2, 3, 10, 11 and 12 in block 51; lots 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 in block 53; all of blocks 62, 71, 100, 30, 20, 92 and 94, all of said real estate situated in the town and city of Newport in said Lincoln county, Oregon. The county clerk is hereby directed to enter a full copy of this order on the certificate of the sheriff for the sale of said lands for delinquent taxes; and said lands herein described shall be discharged from all effect of said certificate of sale, and from said sale of said lands for delinquent taxes as aforesaid. Said certificate of sale shall hereinafter be held by the county in full force and effect upon all other lands described in said certificate of sale and not herein described, as and for the taxes which should be properly

and proportionately borne by said property described in said certificate of sale other than the lands herein described.
