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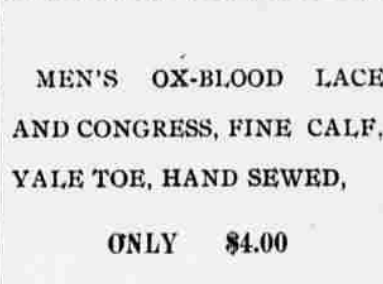

The regular July term of district court convened at the court house last Monday. The Judge and most of the attorneys were promptly on hands. The grand jury returned two not true bills and five true bills. The not true bills were against J. Long, bound over from the justice court on the charge of killing cattle, and Ralph Daniels, bound over on the charge of arson. The indictments found were against Tipton Shell-head, Miller Collins and Alec Spencer, the three Indian boys bound over on charge of burglary; Louis Fuller, perjury; Fred McMurray, burglary; Pete Collins, adultery; Ida Pike, adultery and polygamy, two counts. None of the cases on indictments were tried this term. All of the defendants gave bonds except McMurray, who recently broke jail and has not yet been apprehended.

GRAND JURY'S FINAL REPORT.

To the Hon. J. C. Fullerton, Judge:

The grand jury for the term of July, 1897, would respectfully submit this their final report, as follows:

That we have examined and duly reported to the court all cases where parties were bound over for appearance before our body, and have also investigated all other criminal matters brought to our attention, reporting cases when indictments were found.

That inasmuch as the county court has had an expert accountant at work upon the books kept by the county officers, the grand jury have not visited the several offices, but upon inquiry from the county commissioners they are informed that said expert accountant has turned over to the county court his report and the grand jury would recommend that that report be investigated by the said county court, and be made public, that the taxpayers of Lincoln county may know the result of his investigations.

Thanking the court and district attorney for courtesies extended we submit this, our final report, having finished our labors we would respectfully ask to be excused from further attendance upon this court.
