The Klondike excitement is crystalizing at this place into a scheme to build a boat to go to that country in the spring. It is getting into shape, and it is very probable that the plan will be carried out. As yet the matter has not gone far enough for the details to be planned.

It is probable that before long the O. C. & E. will have a steamer of its own plying between Yaquina and San Francisco. Negotiations are now pending for the purchase in New York City of a 1,000 ton steamer with all the modern conveniences and suited to the Yaquina trade. In case the purchase is consummated the ship will leave New York in two or three weeks and come around the horn, for which trip ninety days or less will be required.—Corvallis Times.

We trust that the boys will strike a regular Klondike country, except in the matter of the weather.

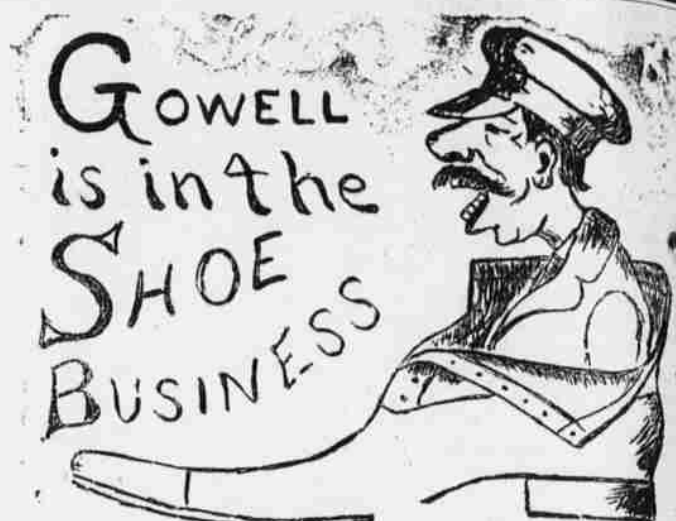
BEE KEEPERS' CONVENTION.
