

> New York, Feb. 23 .- A Tribune dispatch from Havana says: The statement that divers have penetrated the forward part of the Maine and found nothing in the magazine there to indicate an explosion, seems to be verified. Attention is also given to testimony regarding vibration under water before the Maine went to pieces. Evidence as to this fact is emphatic. How far it justifies the belief that the explosion came from underneath the ship, experts may have to deter-

> It is announced that the bids for the Yaquina contract will be called for in a few days. This contract will call for the expenditure of from \$600,000 to \$1,000,000, and will extend over a period of five years. At the lowest this will call for an expenditure of \$120,000 per year. Several firms are ready to bid upon the work. Among the most important bidders will be the Corvallis & Eastern railroad, the Hale & Kern Construction company of Portland, and another Portland company of which W. P. Keady is said to be the chief representative.
