REMEMBER THIS PROMISE.

One of the solemn and absolute promises made in return for the re-election of Thos. H. Tongue to congress was that within THIRTY DAYS from the date of his re-election the appropriation for Yaquina Bay would be passed and work would go forward at once. There were no conditions attached to this promise; it was absolute and positive. When it was made and spread throughout Benton and Lincoln counties war was already in progress with Spain, and the exigencies of war cannot be urged should this solemn and sacred promise fail of redemption. No question as to the finances of the country was to head off this promise.

We hope and expect that this promise will be sacredly kept. It was a compact and a bargain with the people. They delivered the votes of these counties to Mr. Tongue, and on or before the 6th day of July, A. D. 1898, the appropriation of \$100,000 is to be a law of the land, or else the contract made with the sovereign voters will have been broken, and that by the man that has received all of the consideration on the one side.

We do not utter the above in a doubting spirit; far from it. When the re-election of Mr. Tongue was set as the price that must be paid to secure any further effort for this Bay, the people accepted the terms laid down to them and paid the price. We do not say this in a spirit of protest or complaint at the result of the election, but we don't wish to be classed among those who doubt the many and various telegrams and letters that have been scattered broadcast over the district. By no means.

Rather we would be among the rejoicing ones, for we feel that the day will be glorious for this country when this appropriation is made and the work goes forward.

And just think, this will occur on or before the 6th day of June, A. D. 1898. No strings on this promise; its all straight goods. Only twenty-seven days more at the farthest before this matter is all fixed up.

Remember this: on or before July 6th, 1898.
