EDITORIAL.

The senatorial contest remains the same, Corbett having only 36 votes. Some other republican will secure the plum.

We note that Hon. John Daly has been appointed on a senate committee to confer with a house committee in the matter of the revision of the state school laws.

The Corvallis Times still keeps its columns overflowing with abuse of Secretary Alger. Enough should be enough. Its resource of information is the New York Herald and Journal.

We wonder if the object lesson of sending the Oregon around the Horn east last summer and the Iowa and Oregon back will help induce the construction of the Nicaragua canal?

Many of our people express dissatisfaction with Hon. John Daly for being found with the Corbett push. In all other respects he is doing the will of his people so far as we have heard.

And now if the state could be influenced to reimburse our county for state taxes paid by Lincoln county for a lot of mortgages assessed to non-residents our account with the state would present a more equitable appearance.

Representative Elmo Davis has presented a bill to reimburse Lincoln county for the over payment of taxes on account of Siletz Indian lands, amounting to some \$900. Tuesday it had passed its second reading and been referred to the committee on taxation. Thus it will be seen that our representative is earnestly working for his constituency.

For the first republican caucus held Tuesday night only 36 republicans could be found. The vote taken showed for Corbett 31, M. C. George 4, Joe Simon 1. Corbett, therefore, showed a strength of 31 of the 66 republican members. The Oregonian says he was nominated by the regular republican caucus. Explanations for the Oregonian's course are unnecessary.

Our county court should assist two road projects within the county this year if there is a possible way. The road nearly completed from Alsea via Beaver creek would accommodate a large number of people who are not able to build the road alone, and yet, who are no insignificant portion of the bone and sinew of the county. A number of good settlers have left the Beaver creek country because there was no outlet and no good prospect of one. This will never do. We cannot afford to lose one good settler who is trying to build a home in our new county. One hundred dollars saved in such a manner is false economy—real extravagance. The same arguments may be made in favor of the trail to the mouth of the Siletz. Hundreds of dollars of trade goes from the mouth of Siletz and the Salmon rivers to Sheridan. This belongs to Lincoln county merchants and would be spent here

if the roads allowed them to go to a Lincoln county market. As it now stands it is impossible. Give all our settlers all the aid possible. We need them.

Mr. Corbett's election would immediately level Oregon to the plane of those states which put their able men in political retirement in order to advance the ambition of a mere money grubber.—Times-Mountaineer.

Sensible.

More than twenty-five republican members of the legislature, all of whom are honest and true men, have stated positively that they will not vote for Henry W. Corbett for U. S. senator. These men will never go back on their word. Many other members say they are opposed to Mr. Corbett, who is, in fact, the candidate of a minority notwithstanding the claim of his supporters. Withdraw his name, and let some strong, able, vigorous republican be chosen, and the republican party will henceforth be free from the odious factional dissensions which have divided it for more than two years.—Statesman, October 4.
