

ments. The correspondent of the Associatod Press, however, has obtained from a source usually reliable the following outline of the treaty:

Article 1 provides for the relinquishment of Cuba.

Article 2 provides for the cession free of duty. of Porto Rico.

Article 3 provides for the cession of the Philippines for \$20,000,000 as compensation.

the cession of the Philippines, including the return of the Spanish prisoners now in the hands of the Tagalos.

Article 5 deals with the cession of barracks, war materials, arms, stores, building, and all property pertaining to the Spanish administration in the Philippines.

Article 6 is a renunciation by both nations of the respective claims against each other and the citizens of each other.

Article 10 establishes religious freedom in the Philippines and guarantees to all churches equal rights.

Article 11 provides for the composition of courts and other tribunals in Porto Rico and Cuba.

Article 12 provides for the administration of jusitice in Porto Rico and Cuoa.

Article 13 provides for the continuance for five years of Spanish \$8.80. copyrights in the ceded territory, giving Spanish books admittance

Article 14 provides for the establishment of consulates by Spain in the ceded territory.


