WIDOW OF STEPHEN A. DOUGLAS

Death of the Woman Who Was the "Little Giant's" Wife.

Mrs. Robert Williams, formerly the wife of Stephen A. Douglas, the "Little Giant" of the Democratic party, and Lincoln's opponent in the Presidential campaign of 1860, died in Washington a short time ago. Some years after Douglas' death she married former Adjutant General Robert Williams. As the wife of Senator Douglas she was famous in fashionable and political circles for her beauty and her wit. When the "Little Giant" made his famous campaign his wife accompanied him, and by her tact and keen intuition made herself a strong factor in his chances of success. It was said that during the exciting times before and during the civil war Mrs. Douglas never made an enemy, although placed in many a trying situation.

Mrs. Williams was the daughter of J. M. Cutts, Comptroller of the Treasury in the '50s. She was a girl of wonderful personal charm. Tall, slender, and willowy, with a head and face of almost pure Greek type, there was a rare gentleness in the gaze of her beautiful brown eyes, in her unfailing courtesy, that made her a popular idol. Senator Douglas was a widower when he married the beautiful Adele Cutts, with whom he fell desperately in love at first sight at a reception at the White House.

After Senator Douglas' death, his widow, who was an ardent Roman Catholic, retired from society, and for some time resided the greater part of her time, after the French custom, in a convent. It was whispered that the beautiful young widow was to become a nun, the Pope having, it was said,

granted a special dispensation permitting her to be received as a member of the Order of the Sacred Heart. After several years' retirement, however, Mrs. Douglas once more appeared in the social world, and her happy marriage to Gen. Williams occurred soon after.

THE EMPEROR'S MUSTACHE.

A German paper has lately got itself into a deal of trouble by discussing the Emperor's mustache and the barber who has made a fortune out of it. The imperial barber is Herr Haby. About three years ago Adjutant von Hullen, companion from youth of the Kaiser, appeared before his majesty with his mustache turned up in the fan-shaped style which has now become so familiar from recent photographs of the German Emperor. His majesty was very much struck at the appearance of the adjutant.

"Who did it?" he asked.

"Haby, your majesty," came the reply.

"Send him to me," said the Kaiser, and from that day Haby became the king of barbers, and the imperial face assumed an entirely new aspect.

Haby to-day, although an uncrowned king, has many decorations. The latest is the Cross of Jerusalem, given to him upon the Kaiser's birthday. Haby accompanied the Kaiser upon his Palestine journey, and has accompanied the Emperor on all his journeys for several years. His other decorations include the Knight's Cross of the Hessian Philip Order, the Russian Stanislaus Order, a Bavarian silver medal of merit and a Turkish medjidie of the fourth class.

His public establishment is crowded daily with the men of Berlin who are imitating the Kaiser's style of beard and he sells at fancy prices the water with which he claims to have made the Imperial mustache what it is. The Kaiser has his mustache dressed every day and, sometimes, several times in a day.
