EDITORIAL AND COMMENT.

A 78-pound marked salmon was caught in the Columbia a few days since.

Ten cars of canned and one of fresh salmon were shipped east from Astoria Monday morning.

The crying need of the hour is the improvement of Yaquina harbor.—Independence West Side.

Amity people arrested ten business men Monday for breaking the Sunday law and fined each from \$5 to \$25.

The second trial of W. G. Magers, for the murder of Ray Sink near Salem last fall, began at Dallas Monday. But little interest is being shown.

McGrath, who shot Turner in a hay field last summer, and has been convicted for the crime, has been given a new trial. Isn't this new trial fad becoming too frequent?

The body of H. D. McGuire was found last week close to the place of drowning in the Umpqua and was taken to Portland for burial. No trace has been found of Reed's body as yet.

The Filipinos will not accept the terms of the American peace commission. They say they think they can obtain better terms. Our people, however, think they will accept before long, when they have duly considered the matter.

THE LEADER has been receiving more job work from the valley, not because of its low prices, but because of superior work. Our rubber stamp merchants should give us a sample order. What a merchant takes away from the legitimate trade of his town newspaper does no benefit him—nay, not at all.

Some people are roaring at the selling of the chittim bark by the county commissioners from farms bid in by the county at delinquent tax sale. They intend to redeem and do not want the land denuded of the bark while really held in trust by the county. THE LEADER is of the opinion that this move does not injure the former owner, because the bark would be taken anyway, and the county only procures that which otherwise would go to others as a premium for their stealing. If the money received from this source goes into the exchequer of the county, no injury is done the former owner, except such as ever falls to the lot of those who are unfortunate.
