Oregon Prosperity.

At \$70 apiece for steers and 15 cents a pound for wool, Eastern Oregon livestock men are not troubling themselves about combinations of buyers. If such combinations are controlling prices, then stockmen hope the buyers will form a rockribbed trust and stick to their mutual agreements. James McHaley, of Grant county, had on hand the entire wool clips from his bands for 1897, 1898 and 1899. He had stubbornly refused to sell, in 1897, when he was offered 7 cents per pound for his mountain, high-shrinkage wools, but decided to hold for better prices. He held over until 1898, and cut another clip, which he placed in the warehouse alongside the 1897 wool, and again waited. The year 1899 came, and he once more removed the wool from his sheep, and put that in the warehouse and held it. Wool crept upwards, and McHaley watched it ascend with considerable satisfaction. He had 104,793 pounds of the stuff, and finally sold it for 15 cents a pound to Silberman Bros. Mr. McHaley figures up his profits on holding the wool at just \$7500. No other wool is known of here as unsold in all of Eastern Oregon. Robert Stanfield, a cattle-raiser of the Echo country, this county, has disposed of a lot of cattle at a price said to be the highest ever received by a Umatilla county stockman since the country was settled. Oscar Thompson, of Morrow county, also sold to the same buyer, at the same price. They contracted with a Seattle firm for the delivery of about 150 head each at 5 1/4 cents a pound on the hoof. This will make each steer bring \$70. Each seller will receive about \$8500 for the little bunch of steers he turns over to the Seattle people.—Oregonian.

C. L. Shaw, who resides near Albany, milks 14 cows, taking the milk to the Albany creamery. Yesterday he received a check for \$104.40 for returns from the 14 cows for the past 30 days. This is an excellent showing, and illustrating what a profit can be made from creameries and dairying when properly conducted. Mr. Shaw grows clover, grain and hay besides corn for ensilage. He feeds his cows plentifully and keeps a fine herd of well bred Jerseys.—Albany Herald.

Eggs are 30 cents per dozen in Coquille City now, and very scarce at that price. The scarcity of this product of the farm in the past 12 months demonstrates that more people should engage in this business if they wish to have a comfortable income every month in the year.—Coquille City Bulletin.

D. P. McKay, of Wilbur, brought 11 turkeys last Tuesday, that averaged 15 pounds each and netted him \$1.95 each, one of them brought \$3.90. Mr. McKay says it pays to raise turkeys in good republican times.—Roseburg Plaindealer.
