Council Proceedings.

Council Chamber, Toledo, Or., Dec. 4, 1899.

Pursuant to law the Common Council of the city of Toledo, Oregon, met in regular session. Mayor Jones presiding.

Present: B. F. Jones, mayor; John Ofstedahl, E. F. Gaar, Fred Stanton and H. R. Sturdevant, aldermen. Absent: Aldermen Al Waugh and J. F. Stewart.

The minutes of October 2, and November 6 read and approved as read.

The following claims against the city were allowed, and warrants ordered drawn for same: M. J. Allphin, work on streets, \$1; Stone Wells, marshal's salary for November, \$10; J. C. Altree, work on streets, \$4.20; H. Lewis, nails for city, \$4.05; R. E. Collins, recorder's services, \$12.95; O. O. Krogstad, election supplies, 80 cents; Yaquina Bay Mercantile Co., supplies, \$3.16; Al Cation and W. Ford, work on streets, \$6; Lincoln County Leader, printing for the city, \$9.30; Toledo Sawmill Co., lumber, \$7.67; ditto, \$6.60.

The report of the committee appointed to expert the city treasurer's books was presented.

Moved and seconded that the report of the committee, as far it was able to gather information as to the financial condition of the city, owing to the fire destroying a portion of the canceled warrants held by the treasurer, be accepted and placed on file. Carried.

Moved and carried that the investigating committee be discharged.

Moved and carried that the city purchase four more street lamps, provided, they can be bought for the same price as the previous four.

It was now discussed and decided to place one of the new street lamps at each of the two churches, one at Owen's corner, and one at the school house.

Moved and carried that the city purchase a blow pipe to be used for lighting street lamps, and have it ordered at the same time with the street lamps.

The annual message of the mayor was presented and read.

On motion the message was adopted and ordered placed on file.

Council adjourned.

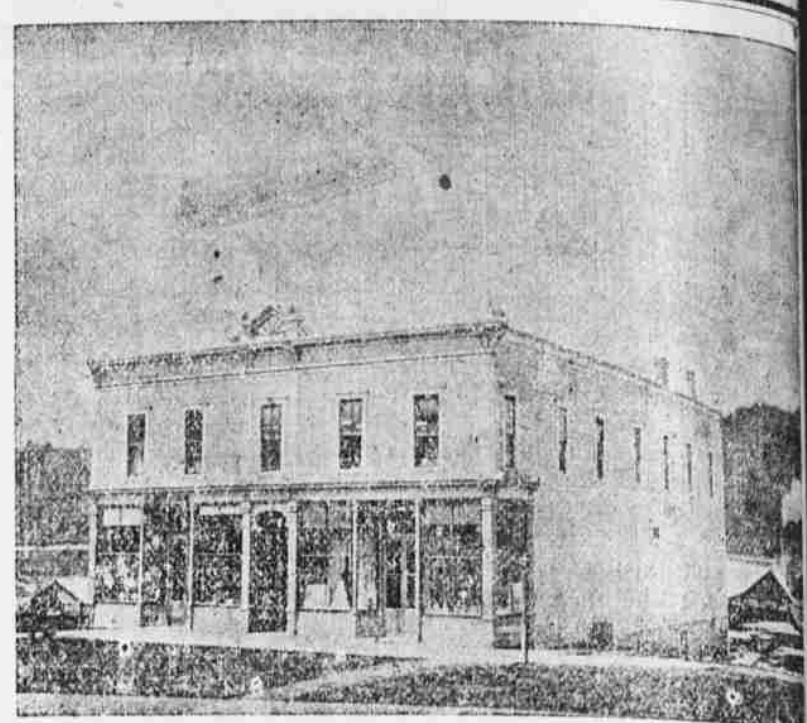
