The Oregon supreme court has rendered an affirmatory decision in the case wherein the Farmers' Loan and Trust Co., as trustees, is plaintiff, and the O. P. R. R. Co. and W. V. & C. R. R. Co. are defendants. This is the title of the case, but the interested parties were the O. C. & E. Railroad Co., respondents, and W. H. Watson, holder of receiver's certificates, issued by Col. Hogg during the time he was receiver of the O. P. road, and sundry other creditors, appellants. The matter at issue was the conflicting claim to a balance of proceeds from the sale of the steamship "Willamette Valley," for the satisfaction of certain marine claims, this balance amounting to about \$19,000. This sale was ordered by the federal court at San Francisco. The Oregon Central & Eastern Railroad Company claimed that Bonner & Hammond purchased the steamer Willamette Valley or the interest which the defendant companies had in the same at the foreclosure sale of all the Oregon Pacific properties and that although the steamer Willamette Valley was sold prior to the time of the purchase. The other claimants objected to the right of this claimant to secure the balance of the proceeds of the sale of the steamship Willamette Valley and alleged as reason for such objections that the steamer had passed out of the control of the receiver and had been disposed of by order of another court and it did not exist as the property of the defendant companies at the time of the foreclosure sale. The decision of the supreme court awards the \$19,000 to the O. C. & E. Co.,
